CITIZENSHIP CLASS TEACHER VOLUNTEER ROLE

The Central American Refugee Center (CARECEN) is a non-profit organization that has served the immigrant community on Long Island for four decades through legal services, community education, and advocacy. We seek engaging and passionate Volunteers to teach our Citizenship classes.

Overview of the Role

CARECEN runs Citizenship classes that prepare students for their Naturalization exam.

- The classes are virtual on Zoom and last 120 minutes
- Each class has two teachers, so each teacher has a 60-minute session
- Classes are in time slots that work best for working immigrants

Schedule

Mondays 6:30pm-8:30pm / Wednesdays 6:00pm-8:00pm / Saturdays 9:00am-11:00am

The volunteer must commit to one of those days for a full quarter (10 weeks)

Primary Duties

- Prepare and teach class on a weekly basis
- Take attendance and monitor students who have upcoming exams

Qualifications

- Passion for service, especially to those in immigrant communities
- Fluency in languages other than English, particularly Spanish
- Some familiarity with the naturalization process and curriculum, although training is provided.

Benefits

- Develop leadership skills
- Improve services for underserved immigrants
- Develop meaningful connections within the community
